

Indigent Burial Program







Aging Veterans Referral Program

- Through MVA and A&D collaboration, both departments will exchange referrals of potentially eligible veterans and/or their family caregivers to promote assistance with programs and services available for older adults, adults with disabilities, and their family caregivers to help seniors live with dignity and independence
- MVA Staff SOP outlining Aging Veterans Referral Program established 4/5; A&D provided training in-service among assigned program staff
- 5 referrals received in March connecting aging veterans and their caregivers to veteran and community resources

- The Department saw a significant decrease in vacancy rate from April (24%) to August 2023 due to its efforts to leverage the Emergency Hiring Authority to fill its vacancies.
- As of September 30th, two staff retired and one staff resigned, this increased our vacancy rate by 8% in October. In addition, on October 3rd, the Board approved six positions. Four were filled immediately and the last two are currently being canvassed.
- As of December 31st, we hired two staff and two staff resigned from county service, this kept our vacancy rate the same as the previous month.
- As of January 31st, we had one staff retire which increased our vacancy rate by 2%.
- As of February 29th, we onboarded one staff member, which dropped our vacancy rate by 2%
- As of March 31st, one staff retired and one staff resigned from county service

- As we launched our new volunteer platform end of November, we are anticipating to have an increase in volunteers for various roles throughout the Department.
- The automated system will allow volunteers to apply for positions and track their volunteer hours online and on their smartphones.
- There is currently eight volunteer pending onboarding and two VA Work Study applicants pending approval.
- The department is working with the Los Angeles and Palmdale workforce development offices to request resumes and conduct interviews to onboard Transitional Subsidized Employment candidates.

- Veteran Benefits and Events continue to bring in the highest percentage of visitors with events (other) in second place.







Q2 - What services are you looking to receive today? - Selected Choice



Legislative Updates

Federal Legislation (pending):

• H.R. 1083/S. 414 – Caring for Survivors Act of 2023. This bill increases the monthly rate of dependency and indemnity compensation payable to surviving spouses through the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)

State Legislation (pending):

- S.B. 1025 Pretrial diversion for veterans. Provides for the diversion of specified criminal offenders in alternate sentencing and treatment programs
- S.B. 1124 Deceptive practices: service members and veterans. Protects veterans and their families from predatory claims sharks and their fees, making their contracts illegal so they're void



US Vets & Women Vets on Point hosted a luncheon at Patriotic Hall to commemorate Women's History Month for women who served our nation and the women who now serve them. Our local congresswoman, Rep. Sydney Kamlager-Dove (CA-37), also made an appearance and spoke to attendees.





National Veterans Mural Project

- Cost estimate: \$300K
 - What that covers: Admin, labor & conservation firm equipment charges
 - What it doesn't cover: Structural engineer to assess cracks in the bridge
- Additional matters to be addressed by the County
 - Accessibility & road closures, encroachment fees
 & permits, involvement of other non-county stakeholders (CalTrans, City, Metro)
 - o These elements may increase the overall cost
